Our School's Grade & Score




- This year, Carrillo received a letter grade of A.
- This grade was based on our overall score of 100.37 points.
- Every year, the AZ State Board of Education (AZ SBE) decides on the scores for each possible letter grade (A-F).
- This year, the score ranges (aka cut scores) are:

Score **Categories**

- The Overall Score is made up of the following categories
 - Proficiency (up to 30 points)
 - Growth (up to 50 points)
 - EL Proficiency and Growth (up to 10 points)
 - Acceleration and Readiness (up to 10 points)
 - Bonus for Special Education & Science (up to 5 points)









- This year, Carrillo earned a Proficiency score of 26.87 pts (85.38%).
- This score was based on how well students in grade levels tested who attended Carrillo nearly all of last year performed on the AZ Academic Standards Assessment, or AASA, in Spring 2023.





• Congratulations to our students for adjusted proficiency performance last spring on the AASA in the following subjects and grades:



Growth



- This year, Carrillo earned a Growth score of 50 pts.
- This score was based on how well students who attended Carrillo most of the year did on AASA last year compared to students who had the same score as them two years ago, with extra weight for students with high growth who were Minimally Proficient two years ago.


Alma's score is in the top third (High Growth)
Benito's score is the middle third (Average Growth)
Constance's score is in the lowest third (Low Growth)

Growth NEXT YEAR


 NEXT year, the Growth score will be based the same model as this year (Student Growth Percentile, or SGP) & how well students have performed over at least two years compared to proficiency targets after 3 years or by the end of middle school (Student Growth to Target, or SGT).

Again, students who were minimally proficient two years ago with growth

that exceeds proficiency targets earn growth points weights x 2.








- To help our students grow here at Carrillo, we:
 - 240 minutes of ELA intervention/enrichment weekly.
 - 120 minutes to Math intervention/enrichment weekly.
 - Weekly data reviews and teacher action planning in PLCs.
 - Teaching assistant, use of Simple Solution and IXL.
- To help our students achieve academic proficiency, we:
 - Ensure quality and rigor grade level work in class (Tier 1 instruction)
 - Weekly data reviews and teacher action planning in PLCs.
 - Common PLCS, collaborative planning, common formative assessments.

EL Proficiency & Growth


• This year, Carrillo earned an EL Proficiency & Growth score of 10 pts.

• This score was based on how well English Learner (EL) students in grade levels tested who attended Carrillo nearly all of last year performed on the AZ English Language Learner Assessment, or AZELLA, and how much their performance level improved compared to their previous AZELLA result.


- To help our EL students grow here at Carrillo, we:


Bonus Points

- This year, Carrillo earned 3.5 bonus points.
- Bonus points are awarded to schools based on the percentage of Exceptional Education (Ex Ed) Students compared to AZ.
- Bonus points are also awarded when students in grade levels tested who attended Carrillo nearly all of last year perform better than the state average on the AZ Science assessment, or AZSCI, in Spring 2023.

- Have your student share their IXL scores with you and consider encouraging them to practice at home. (Goal 10-20 points of growth/month)
